BACKGROUND HISTORY

Simon the Zealot is one of the least known of the 12 Apostles. He is only mentioned within a list of the Apostles in 3 of the gospels and in Acts. Matthew 10:2-4, Mark 3:16-19, Luke 6:14 and Acts 1:13

Zealots were a political movement of the 1st Century which sought to incite the people of Judea Province to rebel against the Roman Empire and expel it from the Holy Land by force.

1st Century Religious Leaders in Judaism

Levites, descendants from the tribe of Levi served as the priesthood. The priest who led temple worship were from a specific branch of Aaron's decedents. Aaron, Moses's brother was Israel's first high priest. **Caiaphas** was the high priest when was crucified. (Matthew 26:3, 26:57; Mark 14:53, 60; Luke 3:2; John 11:49, 18:13-28; and Acts 4:6)

The leadership of the local synagogues fell to Sadducees and Pharisees.

The Romans allowed the Jews a degree of self-governance by the way of the **Sanhedrin**, a council comprised of 71 leaders and priests with the high priest as the ultimate leader.
